- 2. Member Spotlight Senior Center, Home Respite and Commission on Aging
 - a. (Senior Center: Debbie Arndt) Three non-profit agencies that utilize this building. Just updated the building, new elevator and securing funding to renovate the basement area as well. The building is available on the weekend for 'donations'. Capacity of ~300. It's a city building, run by a non-profit board. Looking to expand programming. Senior Center runs on a very slim budget and held their first fundraising campaign last year. Second one will be coming out this fall. All funds go towards continued maintenance, upgrades and programming to fully utilize the space.
 - b. (Home Respite: Annette Berringer) They are an all volunteer organization with one paid employee. Help provide a daycare for people who are homebound and their caregiver needs time to go grocery shopping, etc. Offer services one to two times per week. COVID has brought on hiccups working through capacity. Working through issues of lack of volunteers. Do some home visits on request. Volunteers have to be certified. Couple of fundraisers each year.
 - c. (Commission on Aging: Bobbie Knause) Meal site is at the senior center. Office is located in Oconto 6 different meal sites to offer social avenue, as well as meal delivery route. Provide 150+ meals across the county. 3 drivers who provide meal delivery. Stock Box Program with Hunger task force (anybody 60+ once per month shelf stable foods + cheese), any meal sites have eat in or carry out options. Transportation program: provides county-wide transportation. In-city routes in Oconto Falls and Oconto. In Oconto Falls, it's one day per week, in Oconto it's 5 days per week. Drivers who will drive across the county on an as-needed appointment. Four wheelchair vans. Volunteer drivers who volunteer their time and their vehicle to take people to appointments. In Oconto they have a loan closet for durable medical equipment. Ask for it to be returned upon end of use. Also have some depends, pads and briefs for donation. Elder benefits specialist help people sign up for social security, Medicaid, Medicare. Also have

disability specialist at ADRC. Together run clinics during the summer on the basics of Medicare until open enrollment (Oct-Dec).
