on the United Way Board. Support 211 mental health hotline. Local, Wisconsin-based call center that can direct callers to local mental health services. Destiny - ProWireless/Cellcom: Black Friday sales through Dec 2nd. iPhone and Galaxy deals. Home internet solution still in the works. Hopefully by the second week of December will be able to pull up addresses. There will be an outside and inside option available. Rebekah and Debbie from NWTC: Fall semester is winding down. Spring is January and will have entry level firefighter, nursing assistant, EMR/First Responder classes currently enrolling. Colleen HSHS St. Clare: partnering with Prevea to expand ortho services and general surgery in a more robust way as truly a need in this county. Mission projects going on through the holidays: Food Drives for Kingdom Come Food Pantry, Nurse's Nook and Adopt a Family, Feed my Sheep in Lena. ## 4. Reports

- a. Secretary no corrections as sent/posted online
- b. Treasurer provided to everyone. Discovery Guide expense; interest only input coming into both operating and trail accounts. It was suggested to look into a 5% Edward Jones account that can be tied to checking.
- c. Motion made by Ashley to accept the budget as presented. Seconded by Bill. Budget approved.
- d. City Administrator City passed 2025 budget with rate of increase around 3.1% and a little over \$2 million in borrowing for the Columbia Street project, playground equipment for Memorial Field, street sweeper other equipment purchases
- e. Library The city budget did include the library amount that was cut from the county. January and February sewing classes will be coming up. Senior friendly technology classes through Humana Wednesday, November 27th 1:00 p.m. in the meeting room. No need to sign up. Grinch on Main Street will have a photo booth, take and bake craft for kids, and a voting station for pet costumes. Received a grant through the library system for innovation and improvement. 6 STEAM to go kits (bag with books, games, activities all focusing on different topics; magnets, engineering, sensory, etc) and six launch pads are tablets with 'kid-proofish' cases. Not connected to the internet.

Preloaded with games, etc. available for checkout in the kids section. Green Bay Children's Museum in the children's area will continue in 2025 with some rotating exhibits throughout the year. Children's Museum passes available for checkout and outreach programs throughout the year. Meeting Room calendar for 2025 available for signup if you need a space to meet. Open community space for appointments, etc. Free for nonprofits. \$20 first hour and \$20 additional time after for other organizations. Ashley shared that today is Rachel's 2-year anniversary with the library and thanked her for all she has accomplished.

- b. Trick or Treat Trail: Many thank yous to the community. Awesome support, very humbling being able to see all of the people come out in the community. 28 vendors. Overall a very successful year. Some minor improvements in the works for next year to keep improving. Forming a committee to have support and additional ideas/opinions starting in the spring.

- c. Board of Directors Elections: Bill moved to close the ballot Ken seconded. No nominations were made from the floor. Motion carried.

#### 7. New Business

- a. Community Stage Partnership Opportunity: Ashley shared an opportunity for a new stage for events. The same event stage is currently rented on an event-by-event basis by the Chamber and Sno Jokers for community events. The Chamber and Sno Jokers are proposing to get together on purchasing a stage that can be used for community events. It would be a storage container, mounted to a trailer and modified into usage. The Chamber would pay more and Sno Jokers would do work to build it. The people that assist with assembling the current stage have mentioned it is dangerous, and 'not inexpensive' (\$1500 for the summer). It also requires us to pay people to set it up and use a semi to deliver it. Updated one will be easier to move and assemble. Ken moves to approve the purchase of a community stage and the fundraising raffle. Seconded by Pam. Motion passed.
- b. Fundraiser Raffle: Cash raffle to raise \$10,000 to fund this project. \$5 each or 5 for \$20. Raffle drawing will take place at The Antique on St. Patrick's Day.
